To the Newcastle District, the sum of Five Hundred Pounds. To the Home District, the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty Pounds. To the Gore District, the sum of Six Hundred Pounds. To the Niagara District, the sum of Five Hundred Pounds. To the London District, the sum of Six Hundred Pounds 1 To the Western District, the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty Pounds.

Grant how to be paid and accounted for.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of Five Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty Pounds, in each of the years above mentioned, shall be paid by the Receiver General of this Province in discharge of such Warrants as may for that purrose be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously pleased to direct.

Schools when entitled to allowance hereby provided.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall teachers of Common not be lawful during the years aforesaid for the Board of Education in each District of this Province to pay to any Teacher of a Common School the annual allowance, unless the Trustees of the said School shall make it appear to the satisfaction of the Board of Education that they have made provision for his support so as to secure him for his services in a sum at least equal to double the amount which may be allotted by the Board of Education from the Public Money, any thing to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

Clerks to Boards of an additional allowance of £5.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall Principles to receive and may be lawful to and for the Board of Education in each and every District to allow to the Clerks of their respective Boards, in addition to the sum they are now by Law authorized to receive, the further sum of Five Pounds annually during the continuance of this Act.

CHAP. LVII.

AN ACT granting to His Majesty a certain sum of Money to enable His Majesty to defray certain charges incurred during the prevalence of the Cholera during the last Summer.

WHEREAS during the prevalence of the Cholera in the year one

thousand eight hundred and thirty-two it became necessary for certain Districts in this Province to expend a greater sum of Money than was Preamble. advanced to them respectively by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor; and whereas it is expedient to make good the several sums so expended: -Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That there £567 12s. 4d. be granted to His Majesty the sum of Five Hundred and Sixty-seven granted to His Majesty Pounds, twelve Shillings and four Pence, to enable: His Majesty to pay ty, to make good the following sums of Money to the undermentioned persons, that is to advanced during the say:
