such of them as may appear by such Certificate and proof, to have been so disabled, to be inserted on the Pension List of this Province; and the person or persons who shall be so inserted, shall, from thenceforth, be entitled to receive a Pension of Twenty Pounds per Annum, in the same manner as other Militia Pensioners.

CHAP. CIV.

AN ACT to grant a certain sum of Money for the relief of the Poor and Distressed of the City of Toronto.

[Passed 4th March, 1837.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS under the great prevailing distress in the City of Toronto, arising from the number of Paupers, the high price of provisions, and the severity of the season, it is expedient to assist the benevolent exertions of private individuals, for the relief of the Poor, with a small grant of Public Money: May it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, And be it enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the Rates, Duties and Assessments now raised, levied and collected, or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, and remaining in the hands of the Receiver General, unappropriated, there be granted to His Majesty the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Pounds, to enable His Majesty to advance the like sum in aid of the means already adopted during this season, for the relief of the Poor and Distressed of the City of Toronto.

CHAP. CV.

AN ACT granting a sum of Money for the support of Common Schools, for the Year 1837.

[Passed 4th March, 1837.]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:

W HEREAS it is expedient to grant a sum of money for the support of Common Schools in the several Districts of this Province, may it therefore please Your Majesty, that it may be enacted, And be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the Rates and Duties now raised, levied and collected, or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, to and for the uses of this Province, in the hands of the Receiver General, £5,650 granted. unappropriated, there be granted to His Majesty, for the use of the Common Schools in this Province, for the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-seven, the sum of Five Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty Pounds, in addition to sums now appropriated by Law, to be applied in the same way and manner, and in conjunction with the present sums for Common Schools, granted by Act of Parliament, which said sum of Five Thousand Six Hundred and Fifty Pounds, shall be apportioned among the several Districts of this Province, as follows, that is to say, To the Ottawa District, the sum of One Hundred Pounds: to the Apportioned among the several Districts. Eastern District, the sum of Five Hundred Pounds: to the Johnstown District, the sum of Five Hundred Pounds: to the Bathurst District, the sum of Five Hundred Pounds: to the Midland District, the sum of Five Hundred and Fifty Pounds: to the Prince Edward District, the sum of Two Hundred Pounds: to the Newcastle District, the sum of Five Hundred Pounds: to the Home District, the sum of Seven Hundred and Fifty
