## CHAP. XXI.

AN ACT to continue and malie perpetual an Act passed in the fifth year of the reign of King William the Fourth, cntitled "An Act to promote the public health, and to guard against infectious diseases in this Province."
[Passed 11th May, 1839.]
Whereas an Act passed in the fifth year of the reign of His late Najesty King William the Fourth, entitled "An Act to promote the ${ }^{\text {Preamble. }}$ public health and to guard against infections diseases in this Province," will expire at the close of the present Session: And whereas it is expedient to contimue and make permanent the said Act: Be it therefore cnacted by the Qucen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Miajesty's reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That the said recited perpecual. 5 . maite Act be and the same is hereby continued and made perpetual.
