Most Gracious Sovereign:

HEREAS by Messages from His Excellency Lieutenant General, the Right Honorable Charles Murray, Earl Cathcart, of Cathcart, in the County of Renfrew, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor General of British North America, and Captain General and Governor in Chief, in and over this Province of Canada, bearing date respectively the eleventh day of April, the twelfth day of May, and the third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and the estimates accompanying the same, it appears that the sums hereinafter mentioned, are required to defray certain expenses of the Civil Government of this Province, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and for certain other public purposes for which no provision is now made by law: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and out of any unappropriated monies forming part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of this Province, there shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding one hundred and seventeen thousand four hundred and fifty-three pounds, sixteen shillings and eleven pence, for defraying certain expenses of the Civil Government of this Province, for the year ending on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, not otherwise provided for by law, and for certain other public purposes and services specified in the estimates accompanying the messages above mentioned.
