41 George III – Chapter 1

**An Act to continue an Act passed in the thirty-seventh year of his Majesty's reign entitled  
"An Act for the better securing the Province against the King's enemies."**

Whereas an Act of the Provincial parliament passed in the thirty-seventh year of his Majesty's reign, and revived and continued by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of the same reign, entitled "an Act for the better securing this province against the King's enemies" will expire at the end of the present session, and whereas it is expedient that the same should continue for some time longer, Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled an Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled an Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the said Province and by the authority of the same, that the said Act shall be and is hereby continued for and during the space of two years, and from thence to the end of the then next session of Parliament.
