44 George III – Chapter 5

An Act to promulgate the Provincial Statutes, and also to repeal so much of an Act passed in the forty-first year of the reign of his present Majesty, as relates to Printing the Journals. Passed 9th March, 1804.

Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act, passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the said Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province" and by the authority of the same, That so much of an Act passed in the forty-first year of the reign of his present Majesty intituled "An Act for granting to his Majesty a certain sum of money out of the Provincial Fund, to defray the payment of the Salaries of the Officers of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, (including the Commissioners to Lower Canada) and to defray the contingent expences thereof, and further to appropriate the supplies, and provide for the payment of the same hereafter," as relates to printing and publishing the Journals, shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

- II. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That the sum of three hundred pounds, appropriated in the aforesaid Act for printing the Laws and Journals, shall be expended during the present year, in compiling and printing all the Acts of the several Parliaments of this Province, including those of the present Session, and the said Acts so compiled and printed, shall be received from the Printer by the Clerk of the House of Assembly.
- III. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That the said Clerk shall as soon as possible after receiving the said Acts, send four copies of them to each Member of the Legislative and Executive Councils; four copies to each of the Judges of the Court of King's Bench, and the like number to His Majesty's Attorney General, and also twenty copies to each Member of the present House of Assembly, to be by them distributed in such manner as will best tend to promulgate a general knowledge of the laws.
- IV. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That out of the said sum of three hundred pounds, shall be appropriated after the present year, the sum of eighty pounds for the annual printing of such laws as may hereafter be passed.
