An Act to continue an Act passed in the Thirty-third year of his Majesty's reign, entitled, "an Act to provide for the appointment of Returning Officers of the several Counties within this Province. Passed 16th March, 1808.

Whereas an act passed in the thirty-third year of his Majesty's reign, entitled, "an act to provide for the appointment of returning officers of the several counties within this Province," and which act has since been revived and continued by a certain act entitled, "an act to revive and continue an act entitled, "an act to provide for the appointment of returning officers for the several counties within this Province," will shortly expire, and it being necessary that the said act passed in the thirty-third year of his Majesty's reign, entitled "an act to provide for the appointment of returning officers of the several counties within this Province," be continued; Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "an Act to reveal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "an Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, that the said act of the thirty-third year of his Majesty's reign, and every part thereof, and every clause, matter and thing therein contained, are by the present act continued for and during the space of four years, and no longer.
