An Act further to continue an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of his Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the Appointment of Returning Officers of the several Counties within this Province. Passed the 6th of March, 1812.

Whereas an Act passed in the thirty-third year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the appointment of Returning Officers of the several Counties within this Province," which Act has since been continued by several Laws of this Province, which will shortly expire; and whereas it is necessary, that the said Act should be continued, Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further Provision for the government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That the two first causes of the aforesaid Act of the thirty-third year of his Majesty's reign, and every part thereof, shall continue and be in force for and during the space of four years, and from thence to the end of the then next ensuing Session of the Provincial Parliament, and no longer.
