52 George III— Chapter 6 (Session 1)

An Act for granting to his Majesty a sum of Money for the Use of the Militia of this Province. Passed 6th March, 1812.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Whereas it is necessary that Provision should be made for defraying the expences of Training and Exercising the Militia of this Province, and for furnishing Necessaries for the said Militia where Embodied for the purpose of Exercise; Be it therefore enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further Provision for the government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the Rates and Duties already raised, levied and collected, or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, to and for the uses of this Province, there be granted to his Majesty, his heirs and successors, the sum of five thousand pounds, to be issued out of the funds now remaining, or hereafter to come into the Receiver General's hands unappropriated, and arising from such Rates and Duties as last aforesaid, which sum of five thousand pounds shall be disposed of for the purpose of defraying the Expence of Training and Exercising the Militia of this Province, and such other Expences as may be incurred in Training and Exercising the said Militia, in pursuance of the Militia Laws in this Province in such manner as shall be directed by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the government for the time being; and the due application of such monies as shall be issued for the purpose aforesaid, pursuant to the directions of this Act, shall be accounted for to his Majesty, his heirs, and successors, through the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury, in such manner and form as his Majesty, his heirs and successors shall be pleased to direct.
