An Act to extend the Provisions of an Act passed in the forty-fourth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for granting to his Majesty a certain sum of Money for the purposes therein mentioned. Passed 6th March, 1812.

Whereas by an Act passed in the forty-fourth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for granting to his Majesty a certain sum of Money for the purposes therein mentioned," the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, was authorized to draw out of the Provincial Funds, the sum of one hundred and seventy-five pounds, for the purchasing of the Statutes of Great Britain; and whereas the said sum of one hundred and seventy five pounds, nor any part thereof, has yet been applied to the purpose by the said recited Act intended and whereas it would be advantageous that the said Statutes, and other boosts should be purchased for the use of the Provincial Legislature, Be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, to issue his warrant so the Receiver General of this Province, for the above mentioned sum of one hundred and seventy-five pounds, which said sum of one hundred seventy-five pounds, shall be appropriated and applied in purchasing the Statute Laws of England, and other Books, for the use of the Legislature of this Province in such manner as the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province shall think proper to direct.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Receiver General shall account to his Majesty for the said sum of one hundred and seventy-five pounds, through the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner as his Majesty, his heirs and successors shall direct.
