52 George III – Chapter 4 (Session 2)

An Act to repeal an Act passed in the forty fourth year of his Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act appropriating a certain sum of Money annually, to defray the expences of erecting Public Buildings to end for the uses of this Province. Passed 5th August, 1812.

Whereas by an Act passed in the forty fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled. *"an Act appropriating a certain sum of Money annually to defray the expences of erecting Public Buildings, to and for the uses of this Province,"* the sum of four hundred pounds was granted to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, annually, for the purpose of creating a fund to defray the expences of erecting certain Public Buildings therein mentioned. And whereas the said sums of Money so annually appropriated for the purposes aforesaid, remains in the hands of the Receiver General unexpended, and the present exigencies call for every aid in the power of the Legislature, for the common welfare and defence of the Province. Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of an under the authority of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, *"An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,"* and by the authority of the same; That the above recited Act shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.
