53 George III – Chapter 6

An Act to continue an Act passed in the fifty second year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to provide means, for the Defence of this Province and to make further provision for the same." Passed the 13th March, 1813.

Whereas it is necessary and expedient to provide further means for the defence of this Province, Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an act pulled in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an act passed in the fourteenth year of his Majesty's Reign,*" intituled, "*an act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,*" and by the authority of the same, that an act of the Provincial Parliament of Upper Canada, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the Defence of this Province,*" and passed in the fifty second year of His Majesty's rein, is hereby continued.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government, to order and direct a bounty of Eight Dollars to be paid to each and every Militiaman who may vounteer his services for and during the present War with the United States of America, in any Regiment of Incorporated Militia.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That this act shall continue in force until the end of the next session of the Legislature of this Province and no longer.
