55 George III – Chapter 16

An Act to repeal part of, and to amend an act of the Parliament of this Province, passed in the forty first year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "an act to remove doubts with respect to the authority under which the Courts of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, and other Courts, have been erected and holden, and other matters relative to the Adminstration of Justice, done in the several Districts of this Province, and also to fix the time of holding the Courts of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the same," and to make further provision for, the same. Passed the 14th March, 1815.

Whereas it is no longer expedient to hold the Courts of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace and other Courts in and for the London district in the town of Charlotteville, as by law established—and whereas it is necessary to designate some other place within the said district in which to assemble and hold the said Courts,

- I. Be it enacted by the Kings Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, Constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "an act to repeal certain parts of an act" passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, an act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, that so much of an act of the Parliament of this Province, passed in the forty-first year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "an act remove doubts with reflect to the authority under which the Courts of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace and other Courts have been erected and holden, and other matters relative to the Administration of Justice, done in the several Districts of this Province, and also to fix the time of holding the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the same," as enact that the said Courts or General Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the District of London, shall be holden in the town of Charlottesville, be and the same is hereby repealed.
- II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That from and after the passing of this Act the said Courts, of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace and the District Courts in and for the said District, shall be holden and assembled at the most convenient place in the immediate vicinity of Tisdale's Mills, in the township or Charlotteville, in the said District; and that the Magistrates at the next ensuing Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden in and for the said District, shall be and they are hereby authorised to make choice of the place in the vicinity of the said Mills in Charlotteville as aforesaid, is whereon to erect the Gaol and Court House for the said District: Provided, That nothing in this act contained shall extend or be construed to extend to authorise the said Justices of the Peace to fix the place for building the said Gaol and Court House on any reserve of the Crown or Clergy, or on land belonging to any person or persons, without permission
