55 George III – Chapter 6

An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the fifty third year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, "an act to provide for the maintainance of persons disabled, and the widows and children of such persons as maybe killed in His Majesty's Service." Passed the 14th March, 1815.

Whereas an Act passed in the Parliament of this Province, in the fifty third year of His Majesty's reign intituled, "an act to provide tor the maintainance of persons disabled, and the widows and children of such persons as may be killed in His Majesty's service," which it is found expedient to alter and amend: Be it enacted, by the Kings Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act, passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "an Act to repeal certain parts of an act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, an act for making more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, that the third clause of the above recited act be and the same is hereby repealed.

- II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That every clause, matter and thing in the said recited act, except the third clause which is hereby repealed, shall take effect from the seventeenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twelve.
- III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all and every person or persons who may under and by virtue of the third clause of the aforesaid act of the fifty third year of His Majesty's reign, have received the yearly sum of twelve pounds ten shillings, shall be entitled to receive the further sum of seven pounds ten shilling, yearly.
