

*Laws of His Majesty's Province of Upper Canada*, passed in the year 1816. York: R. C. Horne, 1816.

56 George III – Chapter 30

**An Act to continue for a limited time the Provisional Agreement entered into, between this Province and Lower Canada, at Montreal, on the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and four, relative to Duties; also, for continuing for a limited time, the several Acts of the Parliament of this Province relative thereto. Passed 1st April, 1816.**

Whereas, an Act passed in the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to continue for a limited time the Provisional Agreement, entered into, between this Province and Lower Canada, at Montreal, the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and four, relative to Duties; also, for continuing for a limited time, the several Acts, of the Parliament of this Province relating thereto," will soon expire; Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly, of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled, by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act, passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act, passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, an Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province, and by the authority of the same," That the said Act and every part thereof, and every matter or clause therein contained, shall be and continue in force for one year beyond the time therein limited, and from thence to the end of then next ensuing Session of the Provincial Parliament. Provided, That it shall and may be lawful for the Commissioners respectively, to be appointed by the Governors, Lieutenant Governors, or Persons administering the Government of Upper and Lower Canada, to proceed to form a new Provisional Agreement for regulating the drawback on Dutiable Commodities, imported from Lower into Upper Canada, which Provisional Agreement, if confirmed by the respective Legislatures, may be carried into effect, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
