56 George III – Chapter 8

An Act, to receive and continue an Act passed in the forty-second year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to enable the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, to appoint one or more Additional Port or Ports, Place or Places of entry within this Province, and to appoint one or more Collectors of the same respectively." Passed 22d March, 1816.

Whereas an Act passed In the forty-second year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to enable the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, to appoint one or more additional Port or Ports, Place or Places of Entry within this Province, and to appoint one or more Collector or Collectors, at the same respectively, has expired, and as it is expedient to renew the same, Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'" and by the authority of the same, that the said Act of the forty-second year of His Majesty's Reign and every part thereof, and every clause, matter and thing therein contained, are by the present Act revived and continued for and during the space of four years and no longer.
