56 George III – Chapter 9

An Act to provide for the Remuneration of the Honorable William Dummer Powell, Esquire, for certain services rendered to this Province. Passed 22d March, 1816.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Whereas it is expedient to remunerate the Honorable William Dummer Powell, Esquire, for services rendered to this Province as Commissioner for ascertaining Titles to Land within the same, We Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects the Commons of Upper-Canada, in Provincial Parliament assembled, beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'" and by the authority of the same, that from and out of the rates and duties, raised, levied and collected, or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, to and for the public uses of this Province, and remaining in the hands of the Receiver-General of this Province, and unappropriated, there be granted to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, the sum of one thousand pounds, which said sum of one thousand pounds, shall be appropriated, applied, and disposed of, in remunerating the Honorable William Dummer Powell, for services rendered to this Province as Commissioner for ascertaining Titles to Land within this Province.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of one thousand pounds shall be paid by the Receiver-General of this Province, to the said Honorable William Dummer Powell, in discharge of such Warrant, as shall for that purpose be issued, by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for to His Majesty by the Receiver-General of this Province through the Lords Commissioners of His Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously pleased to direct.
