2 George IV – Chapter 22

An Act to make good certain monies issued and advanced by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor in pursuance of several Addresses of the House of Assembly. Passed 14th April, 1821.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Whereas in pursuance of an Address of Your Commons House of Assembly during its last Session to His Excellency Sir Peregrine Maitland, Lieutenant Governor of Your Province of Upper Canada, the sum of six hundred and seventy six pounds sixteen shillings and nine pence half-penny has been issued and advanced by Your Majesty through Your Lieutenant Governor to the Clerks and other Officers of the two Houses of Parliament to enable them to pay the Contingent Expences of the last Session of the Provincial Legislature, May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province'*" and by the authority of the same, That out of the fund or funds subject to the disposition of the Parliament of this Province now remaining in the hands of the Receiver General unappropriated, there shall be issued and applied the sum of six hundred and seventy six pounds sixteen shillings and nine pence half-panny [sic], to make good the said sum which has been issued and advanced in pursuance of the aforesaid Address.

II. And whereas in pursuance of an Address of Your Commons House of Assembly during the present Session to His Excellency Sir Peregrine Maitland Lieutenant Governor of Your Province of Upper Canada the sum of sixty pounds has been issued and advanced by Your Majesty through the Lieutenant Governor to the Serjeant at Arms to enable him to defray his expences in executing an Order of Your Commons House of Assembly, Be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That out of the fund or funds subject to the disposition of the Parliament of this Province now remaining in the hands of the Receiver General and unappropriated, there shall be issued and applied the sum of sixty pounds to make good the said sum which has been issued and advanced in pursuance of the aforesaid Address.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the due application of the said sums of money pursuant to the directions of this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty His Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the
