2 George IV – Chapter 27

An Act to repeal an Act passed in the fifty sixth year of His late Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to encrease the Salary of the Speaker of the House of Assembly, and to remunerate the present Speaker for past services." Passed 14th April, 1821.

Whereas the Salary to the Speaker of the House of Assembly is deemed disproportioned to the present revenue of the Province, it is therefore deemed expedient to reduce the same: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,*" and by the authority of the same, That an Act passed in the fifty sixth year of His late Majesty's Reign, entitled "*An Act to increase the Salary of the Speaker of the House of Assembly, and to remunerate the present Speaker tor past services*" be and the same is hereby repealed.
