2 George IV - Chapter 14

An Act to establish the division line between the Second and Third Concessions of the Township of Osnabruck, in the Eastern District. Passed 17th January, 1822.

Whereas divers disputes have arisen between the Inhabitants of the Second and Third Concessions of the Township of Osnabruck in the Eastern District of this Province, as to the division line between the said Concessions, And whereas, it appears that in consequence of an erroneous survey of the said line by the late Patrick McNiff — the same has been resurveyed under the direction of Government, by Lewis Grant, Esquire, Deputy Provincial Surveyor, whose line was intended and considered as the division line between the said Concessions, till the passing of an Act in the 58th year of His late Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to repeal an ordinance of the Province of Quebec passed in the twenty-fifth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An ordinance concerning Land Surveyors and the admeasurement of Lands, and also to extend the provisions of an Act passed in the thirty eighth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act toascertain and establish on a permanent footing the boundary lines of the different Townships of this Province and further to regulate the manner in which Lands are hereafter to be surveyed" by which Act the survey of the said Patrick McNiff, being the first survey intended to fix the boundary between the said Concessions hath been established, and it is expedient in order to guiet the disputes which have arisen and to prevent litigation, that the line run by the said Lewis Grant between the said Concessions should by Law be established, Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province" and by the authority of the same, That the line run by the said Lewis Grant Deputy Surveyor as aforesaid, shall be deemed and taken to be the original and true boundary between the said Concessions, any thing in any Law of this Province to the contrary notwithstanding.
