2 George IV – Chapter 20

An Act granting to His Majesty a sum of Money to provide for the Appointment of a Commissioner for the purposes therein mentioned. Passed 17th January 1822.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Whereas it is expedient to grant to your Majesty a sum of Money to compensate the services of such person as shall or may be appointed by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province to lay at Your Majesty's feet, the Joint Address of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of Your Majesty's Province of Upper Canada respecting the Commercial Intercourse between the said Province and Lower Canada. We Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects the Commons House of Assembly of this Province beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, And be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province" and by the authority of the same. That from and out of the Rates and Duties raised, levied and collected or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, to and for the public uses of this Province and in the hands of the Receiver General and unappropriated, there be granted to His Majesty his Heirs and Successors the sum of Two Thousand Pounds, which said sum of Two Thousand Pounds shall be appropriated and applied in compensating such person as the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province shall or may appoint for the purpose herein before mentioned.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of Two Thousand Pounds shall be paid by the Receiver General of this Province in discharge of such Warrant or Warrants as shall for that purpose from time to time be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for to His Majesty his Heirs and Successors through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being in such manner and form as His Majesty his Heirs and Successors shall be graciously pleased to direct.
