5 George IV - Chapter 14

An Act to Repeal an Act passed in the Forty-Fourth Fear of His Late Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to Promulgate the Provincial Statutes, and also to Repeal so much of an Act passed in the Forty-First Year of the Reign of His Present Majesty as relates to Printing the Journals;" and to provide more adequate Remuneration for Printing Annually the Statutes of this Province. Passed Jan. 19th, 1824.

Whereas the sum of Eighty Pounds, allowed for the Annual Printing of the Laws of this Province by a certain Act of the Parliament thereof, passed in the forty-fourth year of His Late Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to Promulgate the Provincial Statutes, and also to Repeal so much of an Act passed in the forty first year of the Reign of His Present Majesty as relates to Printing the Journals," is inadequate, from the increase in the annual number of Laws, and of the copies thereof required to be Printed since the passing of the said Act:—

Be It Therefore Enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Late Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further Provision for the Government of the said Province;" and by the authority of the same;— That from and after the passing of this Act, the fourth, clause of the said Act, passed in the forty-fourth year of His Late Majesty's Reign, shall he, and the same is hereby repealed.

II. And be it further Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the person who shall be employed to Print the Laws of this Province, passed in the present Session of Parliament, may make out an account against the Government of this Province for the same, which account shall be paid, and the monies accounted for in the same manner as other accounts against the Government for similar services; and that after the present year, the expense of Printing annually the Statutes of this Province shall be provided for in the same manner as other contingent charges for the Public Service.
