6 George IV – Chapter 5

An Act to provide for ascertaining and establishing the Division Line between the Townships of Ancaster and Flamborough West, in the District of Gore. (Passed 13th 1825.)

Whereas, doubts being entertained respecting the Boundary Line between the Townships of Ancaster and Flamborough West, in the District of Gore, it is expedient and proper to have the same ascertained and established: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and Assembled by virtue of an under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the Fourteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further Provisions for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, to direct the Surveyor General to cause such Boundary Line to be run out, and ascertained, in conformity with the original Survey of the said Townships.

I. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Surveyor General; and he is hereby required, when and as soon as he shall have caused the said Boundary line to be run out and ascertained, to have certain and permanent Boundaries placed at the governing points thereof; and that the Line so run, ascertained and marked out by the placing of such Boundaries, shall be considered as the permanent and established Boundary Line between the said Townships.
