11 George IV – Chapter 30

An Act to grant a sum of Money towards Opening a Road from the River Aux Perches, on Lake Huron, in the Western District, to Townsend, in the London District. Passed 6th March, 1830.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

Whereas it is expedient to grant a sum of Money towards opening a Road from the River Aux Perches, on Lake Huron, in the Western District, to the Location of a Settler of the name of Townsend, in the London District; we, Your dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Upper Canada, beseech Your Majesty that it it may be enacted, And be it enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make; further provision for the Government of the said Province;" and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the Rates and Duties Raised, Levied, and Collected, and to be Raised, Levied, and Collected, to and for the public uses of this Province, and in the hands of the Receiver General unappropriated, there be granted to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, the Sum of Twenty-five Pounds, towards opening the aforesaid Road; and that Henry Jones of Maxwell, on Lake Huron, be a Commissioner to lay out the same.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of Twenty-Five Pounds shall be paid by the Receiver General of this Province, in discharge of such Warrant or Warrants as shall for that purpose be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, and shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously pleased to direct.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That a detailed statement, together with the vouchers for the expenditure of the said sum of money, shall be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person Administering the Government, to be laid before the House of Assembly at its next Session.
