2 William IV – Chapter 31

An Act to extend the provisions of an Act passed in the First year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act granting to His Majesty a sum of Money, to be raised by Debenture, for the improvement of Roads and Bridges in the several Districts of this Province." Passed 28th January, 1832.

Whereas certain Monies granted by an Act of the Legislature of this Province, passed in the first year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "*An Act granting to His Majesty a sum of money, to be raised by Debenture, for the improvement of Roads and Bridges in the several Districts of this Province,*" remain unexpended, and it is expedient that the authority of certain Commissioners named in the said Act should be extended: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,*" and by the authority of the same, That the Commissioners appointed in or by virtue of the said Act shall have full power and authority, and they are hereby required, to lay out and expend the several sums of money now remaining unexpended, (except as is herein otherwise provided,) according to the provisions of the said Act, and that the same shall be accounted for by the said Commissioners, and returns thereof transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person Administering the Government of this Province, on or before the first day of August next after the passing of this Act, to be laid before the Commons House of Assembly.

II. And whereas by the said Act the sum of Fifty Pounds was directed to be expended on the allowance for road from John Eastman's, on the North side of the River Rideau, to Richmond, which sum remains in the hands of the Treasurer of the Johnstown District, unexpended: Be it therefore further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said sum of Fifty Pounds be laid out and expended as heretofore directed, and that John Eastman, senior, John Scott, and Gamaliel Duke, be Commissioners for expending the same; and that the sum of Twenty-five Pounds, remaining unexpended in the hands of the Treasurer of the Johnstown District, be applied on the road leading Northward from Russel Field's to Robert Clark's, in Elizabethtown, in the District of Johnstown, and that Robert Clark, Ebenezer Smith, and John Henderson, be Commissioners for expending the same.
