3 William IV – Chapter 15

**An Act to make further provision for carrying into effect, an Act passed in the Fifty-sixth year of the Reign of King George the Third, entitled “*An Act to afford relief to persons holding or possessing Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments in the District of Niagara.*” Passed 13th February, 1833.**

Whereas an Act was passed in the Fifty-sixth year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, entitled “*An Act to afford relief to persons holding or possessing Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments in the District of Niagara,*” by which Act it was directed, that five Commissioners should be appointed by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, for the purposes in the said Act set forth: And whereas three of the five Commissioners who were appointed under the authority of the said Act have departed this life, and inasmuch as the purposes contemplated by the said Act have not yet been fully answered, and the authority to appoint Commissioners for carrying the same into effect was limited to two years after the passing thereof, it is necessary to make provision for the appointment of additional Commissioners for the purposes in the said Act mentioned:—Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled “*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled ‘An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,’*” and by the authority of the same, That from time to time, and at any time after the passing of this Act, and so long as it may continue necessary to afford persons holding or possessing Real Estate in the District of Niagara, and so much of the District of Gore as was formerly comprised within the Niagara District, the relief provided by the said Act, passed in the Fifty-sixth year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, to issue one or more Commission or Commissions, under the Great Seal of this Province, directed to any five fit and discreet persons, which said Commissioners, or any three of them, shall have full power and authority to do and execute all such things as are by the said Act authorized and directed to be done by the Commissioners to be appointed under the power given in the first clause of the said Act.
