3 William IV – Chapter 45

An Act to continue the duty upon Licenses to Hawkers and Pedlers. Passed 13th February 1833.

Whereas an Act passed in the ninth year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled "*An Act to continue an Act entitled 'An Act to continue for a limited time An Act passed in the fifty-eighth year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled 'An Act to continue, repeal part of, and amend, an Act passed in the fifty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled 'An Act granting to His Majesty duties on Licenses to Hawkers, Pedlers and Petty Chapmen, and other trading persons therein mentioned, and to extend the provisions of the same, is about to expire, and whereas it is expedient to continue the same for a limited period'*"—Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'*" and by the authority of the same, That the said recited Act be, and the same is hereby continued for four years, and from thence to the end of the then next ensuing Session of Parliament, and no longer.
