3 William IV – Chapter 57

An Act granting to His Majesty a certain sum of Money to enable His Majesty to defray certain charges incurred during the prevalence of the Cholera during the last Summer. Passed 13th February, 1833.

Whereas during the prevalence of the Cholera in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two it became necessary for certain Districts in this Province to expend a greater sum of Money than was advanced to them respectively by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor; and whereas it is expedient to make good the several sums so expended:— Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make-further provision for the Government of the said Province,"" and by the authority of the same, That there be granted to His Majesty the sum of Five Hundred and Sixty-seven Pounds, twelve Shillings and four Pence, to enable His Majesty to pay the following sums of Money to the undermentioned persons, that is to say:—

To the Treasurer of the Home District, Two Hundred and Forty-three Pounds, two Shillings, and ten pence.

To the Treasurer of the Brockville Police, Two Hundred and Thirty-four Pounds, thirteen Shillings, and eleven pence.

To the Treasurer of the District of Niagara, Eighty-nine Pounds, fifteen Shillings, and seven Pence.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said several sums of Money shall be paid in discharge of such Warrant or Warrants as may for that purpose be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province: and shall be accounted for to His Majesty, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be pleased to direct.
