An Act to repeal part of an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's reign, entitled "*An Act granting to His Majesty a sum of money to defray the expense of erecting a Penitentiary in this Province, and for other purposes therein mentioned.*" Passed, 6th March, 1834.

Whereas by An Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's reign, entitled "*An Act granting to His Majesty a sum of money to defray the expenses of erecting a Penitentiary in this Province, and for other purposes therein mentioned,*" it is provided that the sum of twelve thousand five hundred pounds so granted shall be advanced by three equal annual instalments: And whereas it is expedient to authorise the Commissioners named in the said Act to receive the said sum of money at earlier periods than the Act contemplates: Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,*" and by the authority of the same, That so much of the said Act as provides that the said sum of twelve thousand five hundred pounds shall be advanced by three equal annual instalments, the first instalment to be paid on the first day of May next after the passing of the said Act, and the two remaining instalments on the first day of May in each succeeding year, be and the same is hereby repealed.
