## An Act granting a sum of money in aid of the funds of the Female Benevolent Society of Kingston. Passed 6th March, 1834.

Most Gracious Sovereign:

Whereas the Female Benevolent Society of Kingston have, by their Petition to this House set forth, that in consequence of the number of sick and destitute relieved from the funds of the Society, without distinction of Creed or Country, and in consequence of the great and numerous losses incurred by Fire in the Town of Kingston during the past year, the funds arising from the voluntary contributions of individuals have become nearly exhausted, and the power of the Society to afford relief materially diminished, and have therefore prayed that the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Pounds should be granted in aid of the funds of the said Society: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the rates and duties raised, levied and collected, and unappropriated, or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, and unappropriated, there be granted to His Majesty the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Pounds, in aid of the funds of the said Society.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the money hereby granted shall be paid by the Receiver General in discharge of such Warrant or Warrants as shall be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government of this Province, for the time being, in favor of the Treasurer of the said Society, and shall be accounted for, by the said Receiver General, to His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously pleased to direct.
