5 William IV – Chapter 11

An Act to amend and continue for a limited time an Act passed in the eleventh year of His late Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to encourage the establishment of Agricultural Societies in the several Districts of this Province." Passed 16th April, 1835.

Whereas an Act passed in the eleventh year of His late Majesty's Reign, entitled, "An Act to encourage the establishment of Agricultural Societies in the several Districts of this Province," will expire at the end of the present Session of the Provincial Parliament; And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be continued: Be it therefore enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That the said recited Act shall be and the same is hereby continued, for and during the term of one year from the passing of this Act.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That no monies shall be paid to any such Society under the provisions of this Act, until its Officers shall have accounted for all sums previously granted and paid to such Society from the Public Funds, nor until such Society shall have shewn that it had complied with the requisitions of the Law in other respects; as also, that an account of the expenditure of the monies that may be paid under the authority of this Act shall be laid before the Legislature.
