5 William IV – Chapter 13

An Act to continue the Road Acts of 1833, and 1834. Passed 16th April, 1835.

Whereas it is necessary and expedient, in consequence of certain monies granted for the purpose of making and repairing Roads and Bridges in this Province, remaining unexpended by the Commissioners appointed for that purpose, that the provisions of an Act passed at the last Session of the Provincial Parliament, entitled, "An Act to repeal part of, and to extend the provisions of an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act granting a sum of money for the improvement of Roads and Bridges in the several Districts of this Province, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" and also of an Act passed in the same Session, entitled, "An Act granting to His Majesty a sum of money for the improvement of Roads and Bridges in the several Districts in this Province," should be continued: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That the Commissioners appointed in or by virtue of any of the said recited Acts, shall have full power and authority and they are hereby required to lay out and expend the several sums of money now remaining unexpended, (except as may be herein otherwise provided) according to the provisions of the said recited Acts, and that the same shall be accounted for by the said Commissioners, and returns thereof transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province, on or before the first day of September next after the passing of this Act, to be laid before both Houses of the Legislature.
