5 William IV – Chapter 37

An Act to increase the Salary of the Keeper of the False Ducks Light-House. Passed 16th April, 1835.

Most Gracious Sovereign:

Whereas the Salary of the Light-House Keeper on the False Ducks Island is insufficient to repay his services in that capacity; And whereas it is expedient to remunerate him for such services for the two past years, and also to make a provision for the next three years in addition to his Salary, as by Law allowed; may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, And be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'*" and by the authority of the same, That there be granted to His Majesty, to be paid to the said Light-house Keeper, the sum of Seventy-five Pounds, for the two past years, exclusive of such sum or sums of money as he may have received for Salary, as allowed by law; and that the further sum of Thirty-seven Pounds Ten Shillings per Annum, in addition to such Salary, be allowed the said Light-house Keeper for the three years next ensuing.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said several sums of Seventy-five Pounds, and Thirty-seven Pounds Ten Shillings as aforesaid, shall be paid by the Receiver General of this Province for the time being, out of the rates and duties now levied and collected, or hereafter to be levied and collected, and unappropriated, in discharge of such Warrant or Warrants as shall be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, and shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Treasury, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors shall be graciously pleased to direct.
