5 William IV – Chapter 46

An Act to extend the time of holding the next Election in the County of Leeds. Passed 24th February, 1835. (Expired.)

Whereas it is apprehended that at an approaching Election for Members to represent the County of Leeds in the House of Assembly, it may not be found convenient to poll all the persons entitled to Vote, within the period prescribed by Law, and it is expedient, in consequence of recent occurrences, to extend the period for that purpose: Be it therefore enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain entitled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,*" and by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the Returning Officer legally appointed, to hold an Election for the return, of Members to represent the said County of Leeds in the House of Assembly of this Province, to hold and continue the same for a space of time not exceeding Twelve successive days, Sunday excepted, any Law, usage or custom, to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding: Provided always, that in case the Election for the said County shall be continued the Twelfth day, the Returning Officer, in such case, shall not continue to hold the said Election, or receive votes, after the hour of three o'clock in the afternoon of that day: And provided always, that this Act shall not extend to any Election for the said County, except that which shall be holden next after the passing of this Act.
