6 William IV – Chapter 31 (Session 1)

An Act to make good certain Monies advanced for the Contingent Expenses of the last Session of the Legislature of this Province, and also to make good certain Monies advanced in compliance with two Addresses of the House of Assembly, during the present Session. Passed 20th April, 1836.

Most Gracious Sovereign:

Whereas in pursuance of an Address of your Commons House of Assembly, at its last Session, to His Excellency Sir John Colborne, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor of Your Majesty's Province of Upper Canada, the sum of Eight Thousand Four Hundred and Seventy-seven Pounds, Sixteen Shillings and Seven Pence Halfpenny, has been issued and advanced by Your Majesty, through your said Lieutenant Governor, to the Clerks and other Officers of the two Houses of Parliament, to enable them to pay the Contingent Expenses of the last Session of the Provincial Legislature: And whereas, in pursuance of two other Addresses of the Assembly, during the present Session, to His Excellency Sir Francis Bond Head, Knight Commander of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, and Knight of the Prussian Military Order of Merit, Lieutenant Governor of Your Majesty's said Province, the further sum of Two Thousand Pounds has been issued and advanced by your said Lieutenant Governor, to the Speaker of the House of Assembly, towards defraying in part the Contingent Expenses of the said House of Assembly, during the present Session: may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted, And be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'*" and by the authority of the same, That out of the fund or funds subject to the disposition of the Parliament of this Province, now remaining in the hands of the Receiver General and unappropriated, there shall be issued and applied the sum of Ten Thousand Four Hundred and Seventy-seven Pounds, Sixteen Shillings and Seven Pence Halfpenny, to make good the several sums which have been issued and advanced as aforesaid.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the due application of the said sums of money, pursuant to the direction of this Act, shall be accounted for to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of his Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously pleased to direct.
