6 William IV - Chapter 3 (Session 1)

An Act to prevent Bodies Corporate, within this Province, from entering upon, and taking possession of the Lands of the Crown, without permission from His Majesty. Passed 20th April, 1836.

Whereas it is necessary for the preservation of the Rights of His Majesty, to prevent by Law the entering upon any of His Majesty's Lands in this Province, without his assent, by any Body Corporate, created for the purpose of erecting of making Rail Roads, Canals, or other works of a like description, within the said Province: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That it shall not be lawful for any Body Corporate now created, or hereafter to be created, within this Province, their Servants or Agents, or any of them, at any time or times from and after the passing of this Act, to enter into and upon, have hold, use or enjoy, for the purposes of such Body Corporate, or for any other purpose, any part or parts of the Lands or Grounds of or belonging to the King's Majesty, without the license and consent of His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, for such purposes first had and obtained, signified and had under the hand and Seal of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person administering the Government of this Province for the time being, any thing in any Act of Incorporation of this Province to the contrary notwithstanding.
