7 William IV – Chapter 101

An Act to remunerate the Honorable John Henry Dunn, for Services rendered to this Province. Passed 4th March, 1837.

Most Gracious Sovereign:

Whereas the Honorable John Henry Dunn, Your Majesty's Receiver General of this Province, did, at considerable expense, by going to England, negotiate Loans highly advantageous to the interest of this Province: We, Your Majesty's faithful and loyal subjects, the Commons of Upper Canada, in Provincial Parliament assembled, therefore humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain, parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That out of the Rates and Dues levied and collected, or hereafter to be levied and collected, and unappropriated, there be granted to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, a sum equal to One-fourth per Centum upon the said Loans, made by the said Receiver General, which sum the said Receiver General is hereby authorised to charge in his Public Accounts, and to retain out of any money in his hands, applicable to the general uses of the Province, and which sum shall be accounted for by the said Receiver General to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously pleased to direct: Provided always, that the total sum to which the said Honorable John Henry Dunn shall be entitled, under the authority of this Act, shall not exceed One Thousand Pounds.
