

Laws of His Majesty's Province of Upper Canada, passed in the year 1837. York: Robert Stanton, 1837.

7 William IV – Chapter 77

An Act, granting a Sum of Money, by way of Loan, to Macadamize Hurontario Street, south of Dundas Street, to the Lake Shore. Passed 4th March, 1837.

Whereas, it is necessary to improve the Road leading from Dundas Street to the Front Road, being that part of Hurontario Street south of Dundas Street, in the Township of Toronto, in the Home District, in a permanent manner: Be it therefore enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,*" and by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty's Receiver General of this Province, so soon after the passing of this Act as may be required by the Trustees hereinafter named, to issue Debentures to the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pounds, for the purpose of Macadamizing the Road above mentioned; the payment of the Interest and Principal of the said Sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pounds, to be secured and repaid in the same manner as the Monies heretofore granted or loaned for Macadamizing Yonge Street, and other Roads in the Home District.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Francis Logan, Abijah Lewis, James Trotter, William Scott, and Moses Polly, be Trustees for carrying the Provisions of this Act into effect, who shall have the same power of erecting Toll-gates, and doing all other things necessary on the said Road, as the Trustees for Yonge Street and the other Roads in the Home District have, by virtue of the several Acts under which they are appointed Trustees for the said Roads.

III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That no part of the said sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Pounds shall be expended, until the Trustees hereinbefore named shall be fully satisfied, that the Tolls will pay the Interest of the Loan.
