7 William IV – Chapter 87

An Act to amend an Act passed during the last Session, entitled, "An Act granting a sum of money for improving the Hill at the River Rouge, and for other purposes therein mentioned." Passed 4th March, 1837.

Whereas it is expedient to alter and amend An Act passed in the last Session, entitled, "An Act granting a sum of money for improving the Hill at the River Rouge, and for other purposes therein mentioned"; Be it therefore enacted, by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That the Second and Fifth Clauses of the said Act, passed last Session, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

- II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Trustees now appointed, or who may hereafter be appointed, to Superintend the Macadamization of the East York Road, be authorised to expend the sum of Six Hundred Pounds, granted by the said recited Act, whose duty it shall be to procure Plans and Estimates of a Bridge across the River Rouge, and to Contract with such person or persons as shall undertake to build and erect the same, and improve the approaches thereto; as also to remunerate William Weller, for any work he may have done in pursuance of any Contract he may have made with the former Commissioners, Charles Fothergill, and Francis Leys, Esquires, and which work may be valued at a greater sum than Five Hundred Pounds, heretofore advanced to the said William Weller, for the above purpose.
- III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said Trustees shall render a just and true account in detail, with Vouchers, of the money to be expended by them under this Act, to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person Administering the Government, to be laid before the Legislature at its next ensuing Session.
