2 Victoria – Chapter 34

An Act to authorize the Court of King's Bench to admit Adam Ainslie to practise as an Attorney in that Court, and to authorize the Vice-Chancellor to admit him to practise as a Solicitor, in the Court of Chancery in this Province. Passed 11th May, 1839.

Whereas an Act was passed in the second year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled, "*An Act to repeal part of and amend an Act passed in the thirty-seventh year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled 'An Act for the better regulating the practise of the Law, and to extend the provisions of the same:'*" And whereas it is amongst other things enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, no person shall be admitted by the Court of King's Bench to practise as an Attorney of this Province, unless upon an actual service, under articles for five years, with some practising Attorney in this Province: And whereas it appears by the petition of Adam Ainslie, a native of Scotland, now resident in this Province, and by certificates and documents produced in support thereof, that he is a duly admitted Attorney of Her Majesty's Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas in England, and also a Solicitor in the High Court of Chancery and in the Court of Exchequer in England: And whereas it also; appears that the said Adam Ainslie came into this Province in the hope of being allowed to practise his profession: And whereas the said Adam Ainslie is desirous of practising in the Courts of Law and Equity in this Province, and it is expedient to relieve him from the disability imposed by the said Act: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'*" and by the authority of the same, That any thing in the said recited Act to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding, the Court of King's Bench may, at its discretion, admit the said Adam Ainslie to practise as an Attorney in this Province.

II. And be it Further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Vice-Chancellor of this Province may, at his discretion, admit the said Adam Ainslie to practise as a Solicitor in the Court of Chancery within the same.
