2 Victoria – Chapter 48

An Act granting to Her Majesty a sum of money to improve the Cayuga Road, from Drummondville to Simcoe. Passed 11th May, 1839.

Whereas it is important to the commercial and agricultural interests of this Province, as well as necessary for the military defence thereof, that the Cayuga Road, leading from Drummondville, in the Niagara District, to the Town of Simcoe, in the District of Talbot, should be improved: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'*" and by the authority of the same, That it shall and maybe lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of this Province, from and after the passing of this Act, to authorise Her Majesty's Receiver General to pay the sum of One Thousand Pounds, Currency, out of such monies as may be in his hands, and unappropriated, to the persons hereinafter authorised to receive the same; to be expended in improving such parts of the Cayuga road leading from Drummondville to Simcoe aforesaid, on such parts of the same, and in such manner, as the Commissioners hereinafter named may deem most for the public good.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That Samuel Birdsall, of Canboro [Canborough]; David Thompson, of Indiana; and Lesslie Battersby, of Cayuga, be and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to receive and expend the said sum of one thousand pounds, in the manner before mentioned; and shall render accounts in detail, with proper vouchers, to the Lieutenant Governor, for the information of the Legislature.
