2 Victoria – Chapter 51

An Act granting a further sum of money for the purpose of completing the Macadamized Road, between the Town of Kingston and the Village of Napanee, in the Midland District. Passed 11th May, 1839.

Whereas it is desirable to grant an additional sum of money to complete the Macadamized Road between, the Town of Kington and the Village of Napanee: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of tipper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for Her Majesty's Receiver General of this Province to issue Debentures on the same terms, and to be paid and received in the same manner, as is provided by an Act passed for the like purpose in the seventh year of His late Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act to raise a sum of money for the purpose of Macadamizing the road between the Town of Kingston and the Village of Napanee," a further sum, not exceeding in the whole Ten Thousand Pounds, to be expended in completing the said road, between the Town of Kingston land the Village of Napanee.

II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall and may he lawful for Her Majesty's Receiver General, by and with the consent of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, to issue Debentures for such sums, and at such times, as the Trustees for the said road may find it necessary to demand, not exceeding in the whole the sum of ten thousand pounds: Provided always, that before any Debentures be issued under the provisions of this Act, a return shall be made to the Lieutenant Governor of the amount of money expended, and the manner in which the same has been expended, certified by the Commissioners authorised to expend the same.
