2 Victoria – Chapter 55

An Act to make further provision for the completion of the improvement of the Navigation of the Inland Waters of the District of Newcastle. Passed 11th May, 1839.

Most Gracious Sovereign.

Whereas the sum of Sixteen Thousand Pounds, heretofore granted for the improvement of the navigation of the Inland Waters of the District of Newcastle, was inadequate for that object, and was within the estimate of the Engineer employed upon that work, which has nearly approached completion: And whereas appears that the further sum of Three Thousand Pounds is requisite to complete the work, We Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Upper Canada, in Provincial Parliament assembled, do therefore beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for making, more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'*" and by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of this Province, to issue his warrant in favour of the Commissioners now appointed to superintend the expenditure of the said Sixteen Thousand Pounds, for the said sum of Three Thousand Pounds, or such part thereof as the said Commissioners may from time to time require; which sum shall be accounted for in like manner as the said Sixteen Thousand Pounds is required to be accounted for.
