2 Victoria – Chapter 67

An Act granting a sum of money to remunerate Bernard Turquand, for certain services therein mentioned. Passed 11th May, 1839.

Most Gracious Sovereign:

Whereas Bernard Turquand, Senior Clerk in the Office of Your Majesty's Receiver General, has performed extra services in registering Government Debentures, and keeping the different accounts for the same, as ordered under the various Acts of the Legislature directing the raising of monies by Debenture: And whereas, it is in said Acts provided that remuneration for such services shall from time to time be made, may it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,'*" and by the authority of the same, That there be granted unto Her Majesty the sum of Two Hundred Pounds, from and out of the public revenues of this Province, to enable Her Majesty to pay the like sum to Bernard Turquand, Senior Clerk in Her Majesty's Office of Receiver General, for the aforesaid services.
