3 Victoria – Chapter 60

An Act to enable Her Majesty to remunerate the services of Sir Allan Napier MacNab, Knight, Speaker of the Commons House of Assembly. Passed 10th February, 1840.

Most Gracious Sovereign:

Whereas the Honourable Sir Allan Napier MacNab, Knight, has discharged the arduous and important duties of Speaker of the House of Assembly, during a period of great public difficulty, to the entire satisfaction of that House, at a personal inconvenience and expense, for which the salary attached to that office does not provide an adequate remuneration.—We, Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Commons of Upper Canada in Provincial Parliament assembled, therefore, humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, "*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,*" and by the authority of the same, That from and out of the rates and duties now raised, levied and collected, or hereafter to be raised, levied and collected, and in the hands of the Receiver General and unappropriated, there be granted to Your Majesty the sum of Six Hundred Pounds, to be paid to the said Sir Allan Napier MacNab, in addition to his present salary as Speaker of the House of Assembly.
