3 Victoria – Chapter 61

**An Act to extend the provisions of an Act passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled, “An Act to remunerate the Honourable John Henry Dunn, for services rendered to this Province.” Passed 10th February, 1840.**

Whereas by a certain Act of the Parliament of this Province, passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled, “*An Act to remunerate the Honourable John Henry Dunn, for services rendered to this Province,*” a sum equal to one fourth per centum on certain loans before then negotiated by the said John Henry Dunn, on account of this Province, was authorised to be charged in the public accounts of the said John Henry Dunn, and to be retained by him out of any moneys in his hands applicable to the general uses of this Province: And whereas it was in and by the said Act provided, that the total sum so to be charged and retained as aforesaid, should not exceed the sum of One Thousand Pounds: And whereas the loan so negotiated, amounted to Six Hundred Thousand Pounds, and it is in accordance with the spirit of the said Act, and the intention of the Legislature, that the said John Henry Dunn should be allowed the full per centage before-mentioned: Be it therefore enacted by the Queens most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled, “*An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty’s reign, entitled, ‘An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province,*” and by the authority of the same, That notwithstanding the proviso in the said recited Act contained, it shall and may be lawful for the said John Henry Dunn, to charge in his public accounts with this Province, and to retain to his own use, out of any moneys in his hands applicable to the general service thereof, a sum equal to one-fourth per centum on the loan so negotiated as aforesaid.

II. Provided always, and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That nothing in this Act shall extend, or be construed to extend, to give or grant to the said John Henry Dunn, a larger sum than One Thousand Five Hundred Pounds, on account of the per centage mentioned herein, or in the said recited Act, passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty.
