20 Victoria – Chapter 10

**An Act to authorize the payment of the proportionate share of this Province, of the cost of certain
Light-houses in or near the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Assented to 27th May, 1857.**

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the payment by this Province of its fair share, of the cost of and
expense of maintaining such Light-houses as the Imperial Government may erect for the safety of
Vessels navigating the River or Gulf of St. Lawrence: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice
and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- I. The Governor in Council may agree with Her Majesty's Imperial Government, as to the share
which shall be paid by this Province of the expenses to be incurred in erecting and maintaining any
Light-house on Cape Race, or at any other place where it may be agreed between the two
Governments that a Light-house can be erected with advantage, for the safety of Vessels navigating
the River or Gulf of St. Lawrence, or the vicinity thereof, provided such share do not exceed seven
hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

- II. The sums payable by this Province under any agreement to be made under the authority of the
preceding section, may be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, on the Warrant of the
Governor, and shall be accounted for to Her Majesty and to the Legislature, in the manner by law
provided.
