20 Victoria – Chapter 127

**An Act to correct an Error in an Act of the present Session relative to the Harbour and Harbour
Commissioners of Montreal. Assented to 10th June, 1857.**

Whereas it appears that an error has crept into the Act of the present Session hereinafter mentioned,
and that injustice would be done if the same were not corrected: For remedy thereof, Her Majesty, by
and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- I. That for and notwithstanding any thing in the Act passed in the present Session, and intituled, *An Act to amend the Act to provide for the Management and Improvement of the Harbour of Montreal, and the deepening of the Ship Channel between Montreal and Quebec*, the Harbour Commissioners of Montreal shall not by virtue of the thirteenth section of the said Act, or any other part thereof, have any better or greater right to erect, retain, or replace the gallery or passage over Capital street in the City of Montreal, mentioned in the said section, than they had before the passing of the said Act, or than they would have had if the said thirteenth section had not formed part thereof.
- II. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
