20 Victoria – Chapter 199

**An Act to vest in James Barnum a certain Road Allowance in the Township of Haldimand, in the
County of Northumberland. Assented to 27th May, 1857.**

Whereas a public travelled road has been opened through the North half of Lot number twenty-six, in
the first Concession of the Township of Haldimand, the property of James Barnum, and the said James
Barnum hath prayed that the portion of the original allowance for road lying to the North of the point
where the said travelled road diverges from the said original allowance for road, along the West side of
the said North half of the said Lot, may be vested in him, and it is expedient to grant such prayer:
Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of
Canada, enacts as follows:

- I. So much of the said original allowance for road as lies to the North of the point where the said
travelled road diverges therefrom, and along the West side of the North half of Lot number twenty-six,
in the first Concession of the Township of Haldimand, shall be and the same is hereby vested in the said
James Bamum, his heirs and assigns for ever.
- II. The said travelled road across the North half of the said Lot number twenty-six, shall be deemed
to be, and the same is hereby declared, a public highway.
- III. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
