20 Victoria – Chapter 203

**An Act to vest in Wollaston F. Pym a certain Road Allowance in the Township of Haldimand, in the  
County of Northumberland. Assented to 27th May, 1857.**

Whereas a certain road has been opened and is now travelled through and across lot number fourteen in the first concession of the Township of Haldimand; And whereas Wollaston F. Pym hath represented that he is the owner of all that part of the lot lying west of the said road, and has prayed that the original allowance for road between the said lot and the adjoining lot on the west and lying to the north of the point where the said road diverges from the said original allowance for road, shall be vested in him, and it is expedient to grant such prayer: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

- I. So much of the said original allowance for road as lies to the north of the point where the said travelled road diverges therefrom, shall be and the same is hereby vested in the said Wollaston F. Pym, or other the respective owner or owners in fee, for the time being, of so much of the said lot number fourteen as may abut on the said part of the said allowance, or any portion thereof respectively, his and their heirs and assigns for ever.
- II. The said travelled road shall be and is hereby declared to be a public highway.
- III. This Act shall be deemed a Public Act.
